Obstacle course

Plan, design and set out an obstacle course in your garden for you, your siblings and/or your parents. Be as creative as you can. Try using chalk and recycling, research traditional obstacles e.g. egg and spoon. Make sure you take lots of pictures of your course and have lots of fun!



Rock Painting

1. Collect some rocks when you are out for a walk or from your garden.
2. Paint them with paint or pens. Make your message kind and colourful – make someone smile. Let them dry. Take a picture of your rock!
3. When you are out on your next walk, leave your rock somewhere where someone will see it as they walk past. They might even re-hide it.
