Year 1 English

Continue to write a diary of your home-school experience so far. Tell us all about the fun activities you have been doing. Have you learnt how to do something new?

Jack and the Beanstalk - read a version of the story together. There is a pdf copy of the story on the school website.

*Cut and stick story map. Can you sequence the story in the correct order?

*Jack and the Beanstalk sentence matching cards - cut up the cards, can you create complete sentences?

*WANTED POSTERS - pick Jack or the Giant. Write a description for why they need to be captured? What have they done wrong? Describe what they look like and write a reward value.

Jack and the Beanstalk reading comprehension - complete level 1 or 2**.

*Retell the story in your own words. Don't forget capital letters, full stops and lots of adjectives.

Write a verb - Can you add both an -ed ending and an -ing ending? (not all words will) e.g. walk, walked, walking. Mix, mixed, mixing.

Year 2 English

Continue to write a diary of your home-school experience so far. Tell us all about the fun activities you have been doing. Have you learnt how to do something new?

Jack and the Beanstalk - read a version of the story together. There is a pdf copy of the story on the school website.

*WANTED POSTERS - pick Jack or the Giant. Write a description for why they need to be captured? What have they done wrong? Describe what they look like and write a reward.
*Jack and the Beanstalk reading comprehension - complete level 2** or 3***.

*Retell the story in your own words. Don't forget to use time connectives to sequence the story e.g. First, Then, Next...
*Jack and the Beanstalk writing frame - If I had a magic bean I would....

*Jack and the Beanstalk speech bubbles - write in the speech bubbles what the characters might say at different points of the story. (No speech marks needed inside speech bubbles)

Year 2 Spelling/handwriting

Use the Year 2 Common Exception word mat to revise your spellings and practise your handwriting at the same time.

Spelling activity - adding the suffix 'ly' to make adverbs. An adverb describes a verb. E.g. quickly, slowly, suddenly. Can you find examples of adverbs in your books? Write a list.

There is an activity booklet on our website - Y2 adverb spelling booklet.

On Purple Mash your teacher will have set some 2Do's which are about grammar, spelling and punctuation. Complete those and your teacher will check them.

Geography

To become familiar with the presentation of an aerial map.

Go on Google Earth and type in your address. What happens?

Can you find our school?

An aerial map is a plan from above. Can you draw an aerial plan of your bedroom?

Science

To identify and name a variety of common plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees.

Plant Hunt – walk around your garden or local area (with a grown up) How many common plants and trees can you find and name?

Take photos or draw and label the flowers you see.

Art

To use drawing and painting to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination.

Observational sketching of plants and flowers. (link this to the Science work) Use your sketching skills to draw the flowers or plants you have in your house. First draw in pencil then add the correct colours.

RE

Religion and Rituals.

What is a Ritual? (Powerpoint on the school website)

A ritual often includes certain things:

- *Repetition of actions or words.
- *Special objects used in a particular way in a special order.
- *A focus or theme, perhaps praying to God.
