<p>Year 1 English Continue to write a diary of your home-school experience so far. Tell us all about the fun activities you have been doing. Human features = made with human input e.g. house, office, city, town.</p>	<p><u>Science</u> To know what a plant needs in order to grow and survive.</p> <p>Plant your own beanstalk. Grow a beanstalk from a seed. What does it need to grow? How will you take care of it?</p> <p>Write a set of instructions for how you planted your seed.</p>	<p><u>Art</u> To know how to use colour mixing to make different colours, shades and tints.</p> <p>Colour mixing. Draw some flowers or print some pictures. Can you mix the correct shades to paint the flowers? How will you mix orange? Green? Purple? How do you make the paint lighter or darker?</p>	<p><u>RE</u> To understand what the ritual of SALAT.</p> <p>Learn about the ritual of Salat (Muslim prayer) PowerPoint on school website.</p> <p>Activity - Design a prayer mat (worksheet on website)</p>	<p><u>Computing</u> Use your Purple Mash logins to explore the different games. Complete any 2Do's set for you.
